SUCCESSFUL STUDENTS

Student Leaders

The successful appointment of our young school leaders has been well received. Staff have been most pleased by their eagerness to perform their roles and the way that the responsible attitude shown by each student leader.

Reading and Parents as Coaches

Kathryn Bean and Alyssa Marsh have advanced this initiative following their presentation to the School Board last year. There are currently twelve parents volunteering their time to our school with this initiative.

Positive Behaviour Support

Staff and students continue to develop mini lessons that demonstrate what is expected of students in different learning areas across the school. There is clear evidence that young students know what is expected of them within the culture of the school. This is especially demonstrated in the grading of the Attitude, Behaviour and Effort for students in the lower years. It is expected that this culture will continue to grow more strongly across the school with a stable cohort.

Attendance

Attendance records are monitored carefully. Routine letters are sent to parents and follow up meetings called regularly in support of keeping students on tack. In 2016 we continued to perform higher than that of like schools with a total higher than the WA Public Schools total.
